New Local Company.

The registrations of new Joint Stock Companies at Somerset House, London, during the week have been exceedingly heavy, the aggregate capitals amounting to the enormous total for the last six days ending yesterday to £3,839,000. Amongst the companies having local interest is the Old Gang Lead Mining Company, the objects of which are to adopt certain articles of agreement and to take over the mines and works connected with the above company, to purchase, lease, and otherwise acquire and hold any other mines and works, lands, messuages, hereditaments, and mining, mineral, and other rights in the county of York or elsewhere in England. It is provided in the articles of association that the number of directors shall not be less than three or more than seven, and the first shall be George Roper, Frank Huntsman, John Leonard Tomlin, Joseph Cradock and John Ralph Milner. Mr John Ralph Milner is to be the managing director of the company.
